- participate in various wildlife surveys
- make different kiosks at various special events
- be part of a new initiative of our program, the Chimney swift protection

*Requirements:*

- currently attends a college or university and plans on continuing in September of 2010
- posses a valid driver's licence and has access to a vehicle (office situated in Tracadie-Sheila, but the job requires regular travel within the Acadian Peninsula)

- has an interest in nature and conservation
- enjoys working outdoors (even in unexpected meteorological conditions)
- the ability to work in groups
- the ideal candidate for this position will have a background in biology, natural sciences, environmental science or education. Other fields could be considered if student brings positive assets to our organisation.
