

What is the NB Protected Natural Areas Stewardship Program?

This program helps to ensure provincial protected areas are cared for and looked after into the future.

Stewards visit protected sites 1-2 times per year to identify wildlife using the area as well as threats that may be impacting the site.

Since 2018 Nature NB has

- Started five stewardship groups in partnership with nature clubs
- Signed up 10+ volunteers
- Co-hosted yearly field trips to protected areas
- Collected wildlife and threat data in over five PNAs



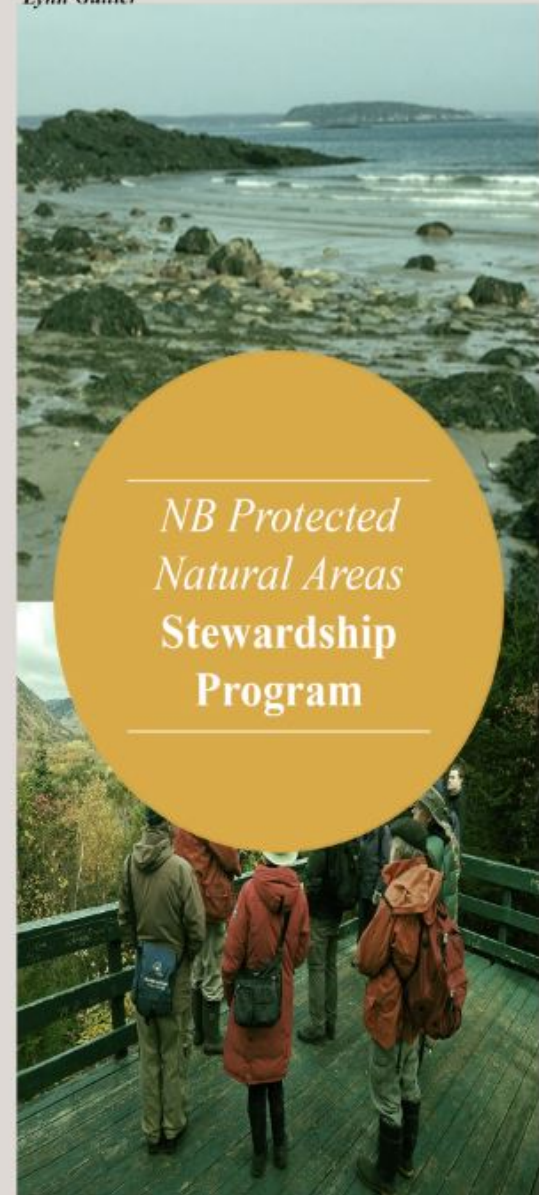

What is a Protected Natural Area?



Areas that represent New Brunswick's unique landscape and natural heritage



Areas set aside for wildlife and nature in New Brunswick.



Provide wildlife habitat, recreation space, and more.



Protects services that benefit all New Brunswickers including reducing the impacts of climate change.

What does a Protected Natural Area (PNA) do?

Class II PNAs protect natural areas and biodiversity

They offer low-impact recreation activities such as hiking, fishing, and bird watching.

They are protected from commercial and industrial development.
